




Social Action Team

The two social action foci for our congregation this year are Haiti and Mental Health. On November 6, the team hosted a pizza dinner with presentations from Gian Polastri on water projects in Haiti, and Mike Emme

with representatives of the Pandora Arts Collective, an initiative in Fernwood for those with mental challenges. It is artwork from members of this collective that was on display in the sanctuary during the month of October.

In addition to these projects, the social action team continues its work in the local community through liaison with the Mt. Tolmie Community Association, the Mt. Tolmie Discussion Group on Poverty and the Mt. Tolmie Community Table.

The team is kept up to date on various groups in the wider community through team member participation in Kairos, an ecumenical social justice organization, and OikoCredit which arranges micro credit.
