

Building Redesign timeline and process: Draft 1 June 3/20

March - July 2020

- Integrating feedback from the good number of people who we were pleased to receive input from. The comments were diverse in the topics they addressed and the opinions raised however, several comment themes clearly emerged that highlighted the importance of:
 - Lots of natural light
 - Bringing nature inside
 - Flexible
 - Accessible
 - Warm and welcoming
 - Eco friendly and “green”
 - Contemporary but conveying a feeling of sacredness
 - Grounded in our past and prepares us for the future
- The team has created multiple drawings of possible configurations to meet the above criterion plus other feedback. Consideration has also been given to the various types of ministry and usage the building will have.
- Feedback from staff, musicians and board members will be the next step in early July.
- First draft drawings to be sent to a professional estimator for preliminary Scope of Work cost estimate and preliminary conversation about this scope of work with District of Saanich.

August 2020

- Sharing drawings with congregation for feedback and response (during week of August 10th).
 - Sign up for small groups of up to 25 to come into the former St Aidans space to view a presentation, see drawings, walk around, ask questions and provide feedback. All this will be done observing the rules for physical distancing and cleaning procedures between each group. We will repeat this process 4 times a day for 2 days (we will add more as necessary).
 - Sign up for a Zoom version of the same presentation and discussion as above will also be made available minus the ability to walk around in person. This is for those who are uncomfortable or unable to do the in-person options.
- Opportunities for feedback will be given both during and following the presentation through an online option. While all the feedback will be considered and taken seriously, it will not be possible to integrate all the suggestions as there will likely be a diversity of opinions offered that conflict with one another.

Sept/Oct 2020

- Integrated plans and drawings revised according to feedback from congregation and board.
- Plans and budget presented to Board for approval and then to congregation for approval and vote.
- Presented to Pacific Mountain Region for approval.
- Interfacing with architects, contractors, structural engineers.
 - Further revisions to the plan may result at this stage to accommodate building codes or structural limitations.
- Interfacing with community association and neighbours.
- Interfacing with District of Saanich planning and permit departments.
- Timeline created for stages of the project.
